### **STORY OF THE PLAY**

This fast-moving musical is about high school sports and performing arts - and students growing up. At Kingswood High life couldn't be any more exciting – the basketball team has just qualified for the championship playoff and the winter dance is this weekend. But not everyone is happy. Parker, the high-scoring team member, may be out of the game and on probation if he doesn't improve his grades immediately, and Michael must choose between playing in the upcoming big game or playing the piano in an important competition. Stephanie also has a choice: to attend the dance or stay home to write an English paper to help Parker pass. The plot and secondary plots weave their way through the team, cheerleading squad, dance club, faculty and administration. Humor abounds as the cheerleaders raise money for a good cause by challenging fellow students to place bets to answer tricky riddles. By the final curtain, honesty has prevailed over plagiarism, mature decisions have been made, love has emerged and everyone has grown a notch.

### **PRODUCTION NOTES**

In the premiere performance of *Hoop!* three major moving set pieces were utilized. One was a real set of bleachers, on wheels, for the gymnasium scenes. This piece spun around to form the inside wall of the locker room scenes. The back wall of our real theater, which was gray cinder block, was used as the back wall of the gymnasium. The classroom scenes were established by the use of desks, with the teacher's desk in front of a flown-in, painted wall. The other two moving pieces were twelve-foot tall triangular units, on wheels, that contained lockers with depth on one side and painted "wall extensions" on the other side. One painted wall piece with a "door with window" cutout was flown in for the principal's office scene.

## **ACT I SCENE 1**

*(AT RISE: Gymnasium. Spotlight opens on MICHAEL'S hands dribbling a basketball synchronized to the rhythm of the music while the OTHERS including team members, cheerleaders and spectators, are frozen in action positions. The entire cast comes to life when the chorus of "Hoop" is sung. Action moves between frozen motion while the soloists sing, real-life motion when the cast sings, and slow motion during the final chorus. These are the last moments of the semi-final game before the season's championship game.)*

### **Music #1 – "HOOP"**

**LORRAINE:**

WATCH THAT BALL TO SEE WHERE IT BOUNCES.

**ANNOUNCER:** What a game this has been right from the opening buzzer! Back and forth baskets have kept both Kingswood and Suffield neck and neck all night.

**STEPHANIE:**

WATCH THOSE HANDS TO SEE WHERE THEY GUIDE IT.

**ANNOUNCER:** The playing here tonight has been outstanding - from great ball handling to terrific shooting. That's what championship games are all about.

**BECKY:**

WATCH THOSE FEET  
TO SEE WHERE THEY'RE HEADING.

**ANNOUNCER:** You couldn't ask for more in high school hoop. Well, now we're getting into the final moments of the game. At this point I wouldn't take bets on either side!
