STORY OF THE MUSICAL

Set in an all-female boarding school in Victorian London, young Sara Crewe loses all her money and place in society when her father dies. Forced by the merciless headmistress to work in slave-like conditions in the school she once attended, Sara dreams of a better life. She uses her vivid imagination to deal with her adversity and even bring happiness to those around her. She encounters all sorts of characters, from the school bully and her cronies, to the nervous servant girl, to the mysterious old gentleman who moves in next door...

The songs have been written for a large variety of characters to allow for a large number of soloists, as well as any number of cast in the wider chorus.

"In My Heart" is a loving duet: Sara Crewe and her father say a fond farewell as Sara begins her life at boarding school. Little do they know they will not see one another again.

"The Money From the Diamond Mines" is a comedic, showstopper solo. Miss Minchin, the headmistress, dreams of all the ways that she will spend Captain Crewe's money, once Sara becomes a permanent boarder at her school. All her dreams are about to come true... or so she thinks.

In "We Begin Anew," Sara steps in privately after the school bully is mean to Becky, a young serving girl. During this uptempo duet Sara and Becky become friends over tea and cake in a gesture of kindness from Sara.

Adapted from book by Frances Hodgson Burnett and set to all original music, this show is ideal for schools, community theatres and youth groups.

- Scene 2: A foggy, gloomy day in London. Chimneys and church spires of London's skyline can be seen all around. Stage center is the façade of the school, a three-story building, severe and grim. A polished, gleaming brass plate on the red brick wall reads, "Miss Minchin's Select Seminary for Young Ladies."
- **Scene 3:** The classroom. Lines of individual wooden desks and chairs are set out for the pupils.
- **Scene 4:** The playground. There are benches and a hopscotch drawn in chalk.
- Scene 5: The common room.
- Scene 6: Sara's lovely, luxurious bedroom.
- Scene 7: Miss Minchin's study.
- Scene 8: The common room decorated for Sara's birthday party.
- Scene 9: Miss Minchin's study.

ACT II

- Scene 1: A street near Miss Minchin's Seminary, a winter day.
- **Scene 2:** Sara's attic room, small, dark, cold, and miserable. There is a tiny pallet bed and a rag to sleep under.
- Scene 3: The classroom.
- Scene 4: Sara's attic room.
- Scene 5: Mr. Carrisford's home.
- Scene 6: Sara's attic room.
- Scene 7: The common room.
- Scene 8: Mr. Carrisford's home.
- Scene 9: Miss Minchin's study.

MISS MINCHIN is trying to control the YOUNG LADIES, ordering them about and getting things ready for the day. MONSIEUR DUFARGE is snoozing under a newspaper in a corner until roused by a group of girls and hurried along to his classroom. LAVINIA, MILLY, and IZZY are primping and preening themselves, straightening their bows, ribbons and laces, inspecting each other and looking very pleased with themselves. ERMENGARDE is eating her breakfast in a corner and trying to stay out of everybody's way. LOTTIE enters and throws a tantrum on the floor, kicking her heels and banging the carpet. MISS AMELIA tries to calm her and runs out after her. BECKY the serving girl is setting the fire, tidying up after the young ladies, and doing a dozen chores.)
