STORY OF THE PLAY

Calvin is a slight youngster who can't compete with the more athletically-inclined kids in the neighborhood. A wise magician lends him an old "Magic Machine." Through its erratic powers Calvin, his best friend Jenny, and a lost dragon drop into odd versions of three fairy tales. In *The Three Little Bears* Calvin stops the bears from eating them for dinner and teaches the bears how to be happy. In *Rumpelstiltskin*, Calvin helps the miller's daughter by shouting out the evil little man's name, and in the third story, *Alice in Wonderland*, Calvin stops the court from capturing the three of them by the smart use of his yo-yo! Finally the dragon gets to return to Camelot and Calvin and Jenny find themselves back on the street where they first found the Magic Machine. Calvin now realizes that his own gifts are equally important as physical prowess. About 70 minutes.

MUSICAL #1 - OVERTURE

(AT RISE: A city street. A group of BOYS race on, ad-libbing.)

KID #1: Let's go! Bobby's up!

(THEY stream out, cheering and jeering. BOBBY gets up to bat. CALVIN, a slight boy, appears.)

CALVIN: Hi, guys. *(THEY ignore HIM.)* Can I play?

(Sounds of dismay.)

RED: No way. Gettatahere!

KID #2: Hold on, Red, we're one short.

RED: Awright, awright! You want him, you got him!

(The KIDS on Red's team razz the OTHERS.)

BOBBY: *(Now not sure he's done the right thing.)* Awright, Calvin, right field by the fence. And no daydreaming!

CALVIN: Hey, thanks, I'll do good, you'll see! Look! *(Holds up a tattered paperback.)* "The Theory and Practice of Baseball"!

RED: *(To BOBBY, laughing.)* Boy, are you in trouble!

(THEY laugh and start to play.)

MUSICAL #1A - OPENING

KIDS:

GET IT CALVIN! CATCH THAT BALL!

NET IT CALVIN! HEY, DON'T FALL!

IT'S BEHIND YOU! CALVIN, RUN!

NOW HE'S LOST IT IN THE SUN!

HE AIN'T GOT IT. IT'S NO USE

WATCH HIM WADDLE LIKE A GOOSE

KIDS: *(Cont'd.)*

HE'S GOT FOUR EYES WE GOT TWO
LOOKS JUST LIKE A KANGAROO
WHEN WE ALL GO OUT TO PLAY
HE'S THE LAST ONE WE WOULD CHOOSE
ONE THING'S SURE AND IT AIN'T NEWS
JUST PICK CALVIN AND YOU'LL LOSE!
CATCH IT! GRAB IT!
CHASE IT! NAB IT!
BE A HERO. NOT A RABBIT!

JENNY:

HERE IT COMES
OH, HALLELUJAH!
YOU CAN HEAR IT
COMIN' TO YA!

CALVIN: I got it! I got it! *(The ball drops in front of him.)*

(A collective moan.)

KID #1: Oh, great, Calvin!

CALVIN: I...I couldn't see it...the sun got in my eyes.

KID #2: It's cloudy.

CALVIN: The clouds got in my eyes.

KID #3: It was easy!

KID #4: A pop-up!

KID #5: Can't you do anything right!?!?

JENNY: *(One of them takes off a cap to reveal a girl.)* Oh,
leave him alone!

KID #1: Great. Some team - a girl and Calvin!

JENNY: *(Pugnacious.)* Can anybody bat better'n me?

(KIDS mutter unhappily.)

JENNY: *(Cont'd.)* Can anybody field better'n me? *(Same embarrassed reaction.)* Can anybody run faster'n me?

RED: Aw, go home to yer dolls!

JENNY: *(Nose to nose with HIM.)* Oh, yeah!

CALVIN: Don't!

RED: Hey, look at the big hero! *(Turning to JENNY.)* 'N you
ain't no good neither! You're the worst!
