### STORY OF THE PLAY

Humorous and poignant lyrics, accompanied by charming melodies, enhance Shakespeare's most popular play of two girls and two boys who find themselves, by accident and the mischief of the faeries, very mixed up in love. First both boys love one girl, then both girls love one boy. A situational comedy of the funniest kind, the drama is intensified by a group of bumbling rogues who perform a farcical entertainment for the King's wedding. The group's most famous member is Bottom, who, in another part of the play, becomes an attractive donkey-suitor to the confused Fairy Queen.

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### ACT I

### Scene 1

(AT RISE: The stage is a series of platforms and trees and flowers.)

### [Track #1] #1 - FESTIVAL OPENING (Choreography)

(While it plays, the COMPANY enters the stage laughing, dancing, getting ready for the "gathering." There may be a Maypole dance.)

### [Track #1] #2 - GATHER FIELD AND FOREST (Company)

ALL:

GATHER, FIELD AND FOREST; HEAR THIS PROCLAMATION SOON THE GUARDS OF HEAVEN'S GATES WILL STEP ASIDE.

LET THE LAMPS OF STARS AND PLANETS SHOWER UPON US

ALL THE LUSTER OF THE MILKY WAY.

JOIN THE CHORUS! SING YOUR CARES AWAY! SOON THERE'S GOING TO BE A WEDDING DAY!

GATHER, MINSTRELS, BRING YOUR TIMBREL, LUTE AND TRUMPET LET THE MUSIC OF THE SOBER PLANETS RING. NOW THE WEDDING TIME IS NEAR US, HEAR OUR CHORUS, HARK, THE ENTRY OF OUR GRACIOUS KING.

JOIN OUR CLARION CALL TO REVELRY, HAIL THE MAID WHO SOON HIS QUEEN WILL BE.

### [Track #1] #3 - KING'S COURT ENTRY (Choreography)

(THESEUS enters. PEOPLE cheer with excitement. A pause.)

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### [Track #1] #4 - THE QUEEN'S COURT ENTRY (Choreography)

(HYPPOLYTA and her COURT enter amidst cheering and clapping.)

### [Track #1] #5 - AMAZON DANCE (Choreography)

#### (HYPPOLYTA'S LADIES dance. The PEOPLE cheer.)

THESEUS: Now, fair Hippolyta, our nuptial hour draws on apace. Four happy days brings in another moon. But, O, methinks, how slow this old moon wanes!

- HIPPOLYTA: Four days will quickly steep themselves in night. Four days will quickly dream away the time; and then the moon shall behold the night of our solemnities.
- THESEUS: Stir up the Athenian youth to merriments and awake the pert and nimble spirit of mirth. Hippolyta, I wooed thee with my sword, and won thy love doing thee injuries; but I will wed thee in another key, with pomp, with triumph and with reveling.

(KING and QUEEN now stand while there is a silent freeze of EVERYONE onstage. In this moment, the FAERIES make their way across the stage in little groups. TITANIA enters with the changeling CHILD, pursued by OBERON, introducing the fact that she and the child are being chased by him.)

THESEUS: And now is the time to rejoice, my gracious subjects.

### [Track #2] #6 - OPEN THE PROUD PORTALS (Company)

ALL:

OPEN THE PROUD PORTALS OF HEAVEN. WAKEN THE BRIGHT SENTRIES OF STARS. CALL ON THE GREAT ANGELS AS WITNESSES SOON WE WILL TAKE VOWS THAT WILL MAKE THE UNIVERSE OURS.

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
