TI: The Mute. Loyal, quick-witted, agile all-knowing, magical; a clown traveling musician. (Flexible role.)

BETHE: The Good One. Young, blind, loving, all-seeing, patient; a catalyst sister to Griffin.

MARYA: The Girl. Practical, straightforward, lonely, maternal, efficient; a friend shepherdess.

GOR: The Villain. Self-oriented, bitter, warped, powerful, proud; a hater merchant of children.

LADY BRITT: The Heroine. Wealthy, withdrawn, hungry, stubborn, honest; a challenge, visiting princess.

PRINCE MARC: The Boy. Young, powerful, lonely, earnest, true; a winner prince.

ERIC: A town crier. (Flexible role.)

TATE: A squire. (Flexible role.)

THE ENSEMBLE: townspeople, fair-goers, councilors, stagehands, merchants, lookers-on, dancers

ACT I Scene 1

(Limbo--what will be an English town square set for a Mayday fair. TI enters, waits till the audience is still, and soundlessly gestures the start of his magic theme music. He gestures the TOWN CRIER's entrance and runs off.)

MUSICAL #1 -- Rhythms and Rhymes

(During the number, TOWNSPEOPLE, FAIR-GOERS and DESIGNATED MERCHANTS enter and set the stage, displaying their wares to the audience and to each other. During the Interlude, GRIFFIN and TI go to and through the audience, asking names, making rhymes, telling jokes, then back to the fair. With the last chorus, GOR and MARYA enter, to be frozen immobile with the Ensemble at Ti's silent command.)
