CAST OF CHARACTERS

(4 M, 9 W, 4 Flexible, doubling possible)

CHELSEA: (F) The birthday girl. She is sweet and somewhat naive.

BROOKLYNN: (F) Chelsea's best friend. She is more studious.

JORDYN: (F) Chelsea's other best friend. She is more artistic and a free spirit.

ASHLEE: (F) Chelsea's friend and a drama student.

GRANDMA: (F) Chelsea's grandma. She was a party animal back in her day.

GLADYS: (F) The almost retired mail carrier.

MARTHA: (F) An old friend of the family.

DOROTHY: (F) Chelsea's mom.

BONNIE: (F) A contractor.

SAM:* (M) Chelsea's dad.

VOICE 1:* (M) A hired hand.

JAKE:* (M) (offstage voice)

PIZZA GUY:* (offstage voice)

OFFICER O'BRIEN: Flexible

CAPTAIN* Flexible (offstage voice)

OFFICER* Flexible (offstage voice)

A VOICE* Flexible (offstage voice)

Note: Characters in asterisks* can be doubled.

(AT RISE: Chelsea's home. There is a couch, two end tables, coffee table, a cabinet, and optional standing lamps at one end. DOROTHY and SAM are checking their overnight bags.)

DOROTHY: Are you ready to go, dear?

SAM: My bag is packed. And you?

DOROTHY: I'm ready but I hate leaving when our baby is turning 16. We've never not been with her on her birthday.

SAM: Don't remind me. It's just for the night and we can celebrate when we get home. You can't beat the opportunity for networking and that possible promotion. Well, let's say our goodbyes.

DOROTHY: Sounds good. *(Calling.)* Chelsea, can you and Brooklynn come downstairs, please. We're ready to go now.

CHELSEA: *(Offstage.)* Coming, Mom.

(CHELSEA and BROOKLYNN enter.)

DOROTHY: Well, girls, looks like we're ready to go. *(SHE does a final check of her bags, etc.)*

CHELSEA: Have fun.

SAM: So, what are you girls planning to do? Rent a movie? Video games?

CHELSEA: We're going to study for a big test on literary terms. It's a huge part of our mark. That's why Brooklynn is sleeping over, and Jordyn is going to join us later this evening.

SAM: You're all so admirable. So, it's just the three of you?

CHELSEA: Just the three of us.

DOROTHY: Have fun. Order anything you want for your birthday dinner. Anything they need to know before we go, Sam?

SAM: Shoot, there were a couple things, but I can't think of them right now.

DOROTHY: They couldn't've been that important. Well, bye-bye, girls. We will celebrate when we get home.

CHELSEA: Sounds good to me.

CHELSEA and BROOKLYNN: See you. / Have fun.

(SAM and DOROTHY exit.)

CHELSEA: Quick! Let's set up the streamers! Set the pop and chips on the table. We'll leave some snacks in the kitchen as well.

(BROOKLYNN exits to get the snacks and, depending on the set, CHELSEA opens cabinets, moves couch cushions, etc. to reveal decorations.)

BROOKLYNN: *(Offstage.)* What's the rush, Chelsea?

CHELSEA: What's the rush? Are you kidding me!

BROOKLYNN: *(Offstage.)* We got loads of time.

CHELSEA: We got loads of time? Sheesh, listen to you.

BROOKLYNN: *(Offstage.)* OK, I guess it all depends, like if a hundred are coming to your birthday party, then we may as well start...

(BROOKLYNN enters with snacks and they start decorating the coffee table, end tables by the couch, standing lamps and any stage prop that can be decorated.)

CHELSEA: A hundred. Give your head a shake, friend. It's only about twenty of our friends.

BROOKLYNN: That's not too bad. Who's all coming?

CHELSEA: Let's see, there's Anne, Lacey, Tamara, Axil, Matteo, Devin, Clay, Tony.

BROOKLYNN: How about Ashlee? She's always with Tony. And she's right next door.

CHELSEA: No, she's not coming, she's got some kind of drama production to do this weekend with some students from school.

BROOKLYNN: Too bad. She's a real party animal. Who else is coming?

CHELSEA: Um, oh, there's the Muffin Man.

BROOKLYNN: The Muffin Man?

CHELSEA: Well, to top things off, there's Nickie and the Snippy Boppers. And they're going to sing the Beatles' birthday song just for me!

BROOKLYNN: Cool! Where are they setting up?
