STORY OF THE PLAY

ACT I
Scene 1

The Day Before Auditions.

(AT RISE: The auditorium of Hilltop High School, a bare stage with an upright piano. MUSIC starts. PRINCIPAL SANDERS enters putting up signs on the walls saying, "Musical Auditions." STUDENTS enter and, upon seeing the signs, become excited about the chance to perform in a musical. Some are carrying copies of the audition flyer.)

SONG #1 – A MUSICAL!

STUDENTS: *(Sing.)*

A MUSICAL? A MUSICAL? THIS SIGN SAYS THAT WE'RE GONNA
DO A MUSICAL.

A MUSICAL? A MUSICAL! I CAN'T BELIEVE WE'RE GONNA DO A
MUSICAL.

AUDITIONS ARE TOMORROW AFTERNOON AT THREE.

I CAN'T BELIEVE I'LL FINALLY GET THE CHANCE TO BE
IN A MUSICAL! IN A MUSICAL!

(MISS PEGGY DONAHUE, the school chorus director, enters carrying one of the audition flyers. She approaches PRINCIPAL SANDERS.)

PEGGY: Principal Sanders?

SANDERS: Yes, Miss Donahue?

PEGGY: Is it true that you have decided to have Hilltop High put on its
first musical in 20 years?

SANDERS: Absolutely, Miss Donahue. And you are directing it. Meet
me back here in 15 minutes. *(SANDERS walks away quickly, PEGGY pursues.)*

PEGGY: But ... but ... but ...

SANDERS: Fifteen minutes, Miss Donahue. *(PEGGY and SANDERS exit.)*

STUDENTS: *(Sing.)*
